Dear Chairman DeRicco and Members of the Board:

Animal Victory is an animal advocacy organization that works to expose severe cruelty and advocate for the protection of animals.

In 2022, we worked with the Board on our petition opposing Jason Brown's parole. We submitted 16,271 signatures. The Board denied his release. Brown was denied again in 2025.

Here we are again. Animal Victory now brings the voices of **18,299 people** who oppose Brown's release and demand that he remain in prison.

Why we are asking you to deny release:

- Brown was arrested in 2014 and sentenced in 2015 to 11 to 28 years in prison for seven felony counts involving the torture and killing of dogs.
 - The crimes involved extreme cruelty, dismemberment, and recorded abuse. The judge imposed the maximum sentence available under the charges for a reason.
 - Brown has already had two chances at parole. The Board denied him in 2022 and again in 2025.
 - Animal Victory has received a reported, unverified allegation that Brown was heard while incarcerated saying that he "can't wait to get out and kill people." We ask the Board to check NDOC records, staff reports, investigations, and recorded communications for any evidence that confirms or disproves that statement before making this decision.
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In Animal Victory's view, the documented torture, dismemberment, and recording of violence in this case present the kind of extreme warning signs the public associates with a Jeffrey Dahmer-type danger profile. We are not diagnosing Jason Brown or claiming he is Jeffrey Dahmer. We are asking the Board to treat the documented facts, and any verified evidence of current threats or dangerous conduct, with the highest level of caution.

If any of you have children or grandchildren with dogs or cats, we beg you to tell them what Jason Brown did and ask them whether he should be in jail for his full term. Whatever they tell you is your answer.

The maximum sentence was imposed because this case warranted it. Please deny Mandatory Parole Release on August 27 and keep Jason Brown in prison for the balance of his sentence.
