

Chronological Timeline

May 2025

- **Cat #1**, an 8-year-old yellow cat belonging to the **Reporting Witness**, was found deceased in the Reporting Witness's backyard.
 - Cat #1 had suffered **blunt force trauma to the head**, and **all of its teeth had been knocked out**.
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Approximately Five Weeks Later (June 2025)

- **Cat #2**, another cat belonging to the Reporting Witness, was found with **severe blunt force trauma to the head**.
 - Nearly all of Cat #2's teeth had been knocked out.
 - One remaining tooth had punctured the cat's lip.
 - The Reporting Witness states there were **no signs indicating Cat #2 had been struck by a vehicle**.
 - Cat #2 initially survived but died **10 days later** despite veterinary treatment.
 - The Reporting Witness states she has **veterinary documentation** concluding Cat #2's injuries resulted from blunt force trauma.
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July 7, 2026

- Animal Victory received a voicemail from the Reporting Witness regarding allegations involving a **10-year-old accused of brutalizing and killing neighborhood cats**.
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July 8, 2026

- This case summary was prepared based upon a discussion with the Reporting Witness.
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August 22, 2025 – Morning Incident

Discovery of Cats #3 and #4

- Witness #1 observed a deceased white cat (**Cat #3**) near the Reporting Witness's residence and alerted the Reporting Witness.
 - Witness #2, walking separately a few minutes later, states he observed the accused **slamming another white cat's head onto a driveway**.
 - Witness #2 yelled at the accused, after which the accused went inside and the injured white cat (**Cat #4**) ran away.
 - The Reporting Witness identified both white cats as belonging to the same neighboring household.
 - The Reporting Witness and Witness #1 each called **911**.
 - The Reporting Witness, Witness #1, and Witness #2 then went to speak with the accused's mother regarding the incident.
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Conversation with the Accused's Parents

- The accused's mother initially stated that the accused had **not been outside**.
 - According to the summary, two younger siblings stated that the accused **had been outside**.
 - The accused's father came to the door, yelled at the Reporting Witness, and allegedly **threw the deceased cat into the neighboring yard**.
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Police Response

- **Officer Cameron Gilroy** responded to the scene, and the case was opened.
 - According to the summary, Officer Gilroy recovered Cat #3 after learning the cat had been placed into a trash container.
 - Witness #2 informed police that he witnessed the assault on Cat #4.
 - Cat #4 was later found alive at its home.
 - The owner of Cat #4 reportedly stated that Cat #3 was **not** theirs.
 - Officer Gilroy attempted to speak with the accused's family but was reportedly denied access to the home.
 - According to the summary, the accused's father stated that an **8-year-old daughter**, rather than the accused, was responsible for Cat #3's death.
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Colorado Juvenile Law (Referenced in Summary)

- The summary states Colorado law does **not** permit children under age 10 to be found guilty of a criminal offense.
- The document cites this as the reason given for identifying an **8-year-old**, rather than the accused, as responsible for Cat #3's death.

September 2025

- The Reporting Witness distributed **more than 150 neighborhood flyers** asking residents whether their pets had returned home injured or disappeared.
- **Six neighbors** reportedly contacted the Reporting Witness.
- The Reporting Witness learned:
 - One cat never returned home.
 - Two cats were found dead.
 - The remaining cats returned home injured and later died.
- Officer Gilroy opened **Loveland Police Case #LP25-000-7097**.

Investigation

According to the Summary

- Witness #1 and Witness #2 were **not contacted again** after reporting the August incident.
- Officer Gilroy stated that Cat #3 had been sent to **Colorado State University** for a necropsy and DNA testing.

December 2025

- The Reporting Witness contacted Officer Gilroy for an update.

According to the Summary, Officer Gilroy Stated:

- DNA results had been received.
- A warrant had been issued for the accused.

Additionally:

- The Reporting Witness informed Officer Gilroy that **six additional neighborhood cats** had reportedly been injured or had disappeared.
 - Officer Gilroy reportedly stated that **school staff had contacted police** after other children allegedly discussed the incident at school.
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Three Weeks Later

- The Reporting Witness called police after observing the accused outside.

According to the Summary:

- The accused was taken inside shortly afterward.
 - Police did **not** serve a warrant.
 - The accused was later removed from school by the parents.
 - Police were allegedly denied entry to the residence.
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Subsequent Follow-Up

- The Reporting Witness later contacted police and was reportedly told **there was no warrant in the system.**

According to the Summary:

- Officer Gilroy later stated there was **no warrant because Witness #2 could not identify the accused in a lineup.**
 - The Reporting Witness states she later learned **no lineup had occurred.**
 - The Reporting Witness reported this concern to **Sgt. Megan Adent.**
 - Sgt. Megan Adent reportedly stated the Reporting Witness had misunderstood Officer Gilroy's earlier statements.
 - The Reporting Witness states **this conversation was recorded.**
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Current Status

- The Reporting Witness states she seeks:
 - **Accountability** for the deaths and injuries to neighborhood cats.
 - **Psychological intervention** for the accused.
- The summary concludes by stating the case was:
 - **Never prosecuted,** and
 - **Never forwarded to the District Attorney's Office.**
